# Gospel Reading: Luke 24.1-12

- <sup>1</sup> Very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb, carrying the spices they had prepared. <sup>2</sup> They found the stone rolled away from the entrance to the tomb, <sup>3</sup> so they went in; but they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup> They stood there puzzled about this, when suddenly two men in bright shining clothes stood by them. <sup>5</sup> Full of fear, the women bowed down to the ground, as the men said to them, "Why are you looking among the dead for one who is alive? <sup>6</sup> He is not here; he has been raised. Remember what he said to you while he was in Galilee:
- <sup>7</sup> 'The Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, be crucified, and three days later rise to life.' "
- <sup>8</sup> Then the women remembered his words, <sup>9</sup> returned from the tomb, and told all these things to the eleven disciples and all the rest. <sup>10</sup> The women were Mary Magdalene, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James; they and the other women with them told these things to the apostles. <sup>11</sup> But the apostles thought that what the women said was nonsense, and they did not believe them. <sup>12</sup> But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; he bent down and saw the linen wrappings but nothing else. Then he went back home amazed at what had happened.
